As we move forward into an exciting future for Stan Hywet, a new chapter is being written, following a seamless transition to new leadership in 2017. The blueprint of sustainability began in 2009 when Linda Conrad assumed the role of President & Executive Director, guiding the estate over the next eight years through a dramatic transformation financially, strategically and culturally.

Today Stan Hywet is visited by guests of all ages from across the globe, has some of the highest guest satisfaction results in the museum industry, and is known to have among the most innovative and entertaining programming to engage and immerse guests in the stories of the Seiberling family and the Estate. These accomplishments have positioned Stan Hywet to continue to prosper.

Continuing this momentum in 2017, we celebrated the Seiberling Family's impact on Akron and the surrounding community with the season's theme **Community – Not for Us Alone**. LightNights presented the Seiberling legacy in a way never before imagined to thousands of visitors in the evenings, utilizing new state of the art technology and beautiful lighted gardens. We're excited to share this fun filled experience for a second season in 2018.

The beauty of the landscapes and gardens encompassing the estate were once again on display through the enormous efforts of our talented horticulture team and volunteers. In addition to providing serenity and the sanctuary of nature to all of our visitors, the gardens provided a backdrop for over 70 wedding ceremonies commencing a lifetime of memories in marriage planned and executed by Stan Hywet's passionate Rentals team.



Restoration work also continued in 2017 both inside the Manor House and on the grounds. More restored rooms were revealed including the Great Hall and North Hallway. Our team was extremely excited to return the restored Hidden Aspect and stabilized cliff face to the landscape as part of the Tea House restoration project, reopening views of beautiful vistas not seen in over a decade. These efforts continue our commitment made during the 2015 2nd Century restoration campaign and could not have been accomplished without the generous support provided by our donors. The result of these efforts detailed within this annual report, was a season anchored by a proud and deep heritage, and emboldened by the promise that the Seiberlings' legacy continues to be shared by the staff, board and volunteers who are proudly guided in their work every day by a mission that is passionately embraced and celebrated.

SETTING AN EXAMPLE

The Seiberling's philanthropic spirit lives on

During F.A.'s lifetime, the Seiberling name was synonymous with the tire and rubber industry. Nationally he was recognized as the co-founder with his brother C.W. of first The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company and later, the Seiberling Rubber Company.

In 1887, F.A. married Gertrude Penfield, a classmate of his sister Hattie's, from a prominent family in Willoughby, Ohio. The couple settled in Akron and raised six children. When building Stan Hywet Hall, the couple selected the motto "Non Nobis Solum" for their home meaning "Not for Us Alone." It was a belief the couple continued to embody for the next sixty years.

During their lifetime, the family used its fortune and influence to create fair housing, build a hospital, improve transportation both locally and nationally, preserve green space for the community's enjoyment and fund countless arts and culture programs and organizations.

F.A. believed true prosperity was gained through the enlightenment and improvement of every citizen. While Stan Hywet Hall stands as a tribute to the family and the times in which they lived, the Seiberlings' greatest legacy is in the homes, parks, businesses and organizations they funded or supported over one hundred years ago that continue to impact Akron today.

"One reason we all like the Seiberlings is because they never went 'high hat' on Akron; perhaps no other local family ever enjoyed greater prosperity and achievement. . . yet they were never so busy as to turn a disinterested ear to any pleader for Akron's future or civic welfare. . . No man in Akron ever had a broader conception of Akron's civic problems than Frank Seiberling.

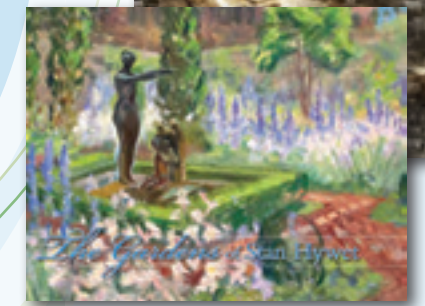

Translated from the Latin as Not for Us Alone, this message, enshrined above the Manor House front door is an enduring reminder that F.A. and Gertrude were devoted to creating something much more than a family home. They immersed themselves in building a strong and vibrant community. Evidence of that work continues to thrive in Akron and beyond. Those stories were shared through a new Manor House exhibit titled **The Seiberling Legacy**, a companion book, and a new summer public event titled **LightNights**, all of which highlighted the 2017 season.



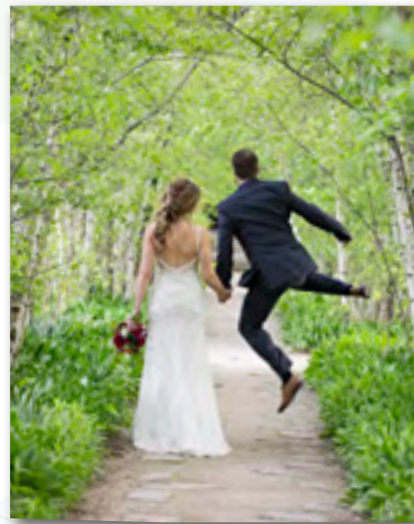
Stan Hywet book series

Bringing people together



With every new season, the passing of time at Stan Hywet is celebrated in a way that would have pleased the Seiberlings – by a constantly evolving, open invitation to gather, experience, contribute and share.

In 2017, time played out in the daily summer influx of laughing children as they dashed through the splash fountain in **Playgarden**, and among the scores of students and educators fanned out across the Estate with workbooks in hand. It was calculated by the ebb and flow of crowds of auto enthusiasts gathered for the **Father's Day Car Show**, butterfly watchers who roamed the habitat and the estate in search of a new species they hadn't previously discovered, and by couples who strolled the gardens, glass of wine in hand, enjoying a summer evening on a **LightNights** date night. Time was shared by guests who shopped **Molly's Boutique** and the tented aisles at **Murder in the Mansion**, by families returning to immerse themselves in the familiar holiday delights of **Deck the Hall**, and by dozens of radiant brides who took

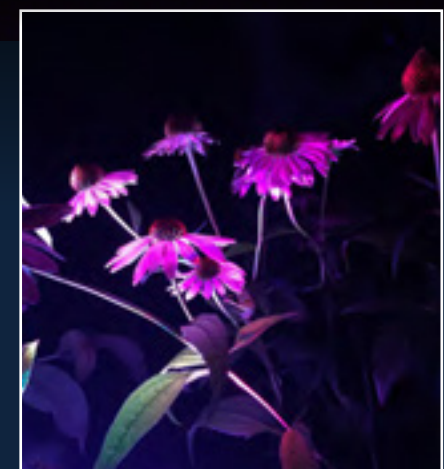
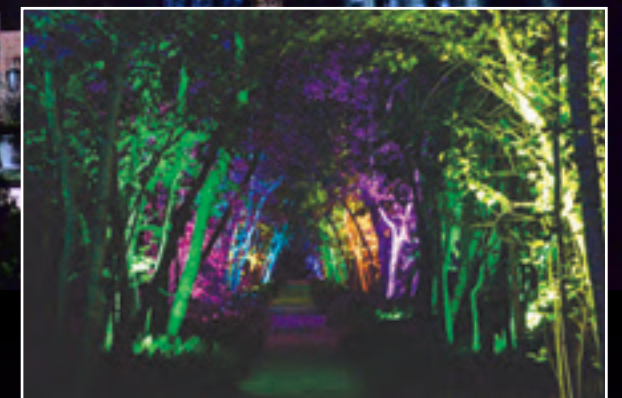
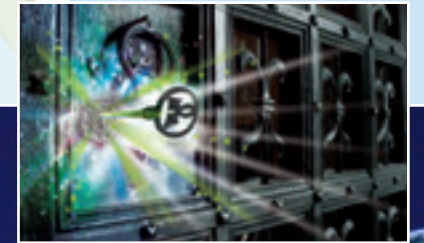
their time as they were escorted at their **weddings** down the garden aisles to say their vows.

Restoring the passage of time was also apparent. It was reflected in the skill of a stone mason, a tile or stained glass expert, and more than one conservator. And it was measured in the work of the curator, the architect, the horticulturist and dozens of other passionate staff members and volunteers who applied their distinct expertise, skills, interests and experiences in the service of sharing and sustaining this century-old story-rich community called Stan Hywet Hall & Gardens.

100 YEARS OF HISTORY

Captured in 21st Century Technology



21st Century technology gave rise to a new and innovative approach to present the Seiberling legacy to Stan Hywet audiences. The captivating family story highlights the building of community and was brought to life using 3D projection mapping on a spectacular canvas – the back of the historic Manor House. The nine-minute show magically and mysteriously transformed the architecture into an extraordinary and ever-changing 3-D environment created with lights, music and motion. It was an entertaining and powerful centerpiece of a new summer event titled LightNights.

Shown after dark on 16 summer evenings, guests arrived early to enjoy music and refreshments in the courtyard, and stroll the Great Garden and Birch Tree Allee, both enhanced by music and the surprise of dramatic lighting and artistic sculptures. It was a lovely way to welcome new and returning guests while sharing the deeper story that has contributed to making Stan Hywet Hall & Gardens an iconic treasure for more than a hundred years.

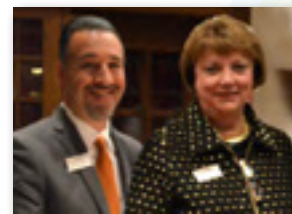

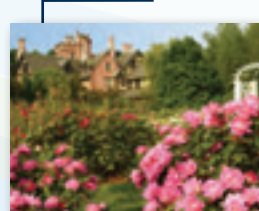

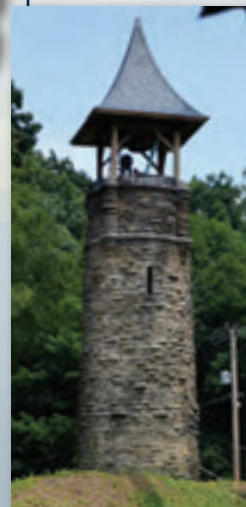

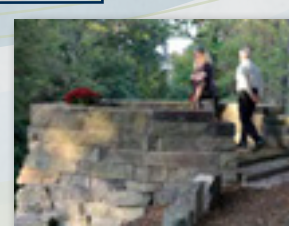

A high priority for the Estate, it was and is a privilege to steward the resources entrusted to Stan Hywet by investing in the local community in a way that also ensures the highest quality and execution of the work defined by the restoration plan.

The talented stone masons, stained glass window and chandelier restorers, draperists, fabric makers, painters, glazers, carpet makers, woodworkers, sculptors, upholsterers, and conservators in every medium are among the professionals whose time and unique expertise is dedicated to restoring the vast array of artifacts and features of the Stan Hywet estate to their original 1915 quality and appearance. Educating a Community

An education program that began by partnering with **Akron Public Schools** to provide a standards-based curriculum using the Stan Hywet estate as a learning lab, has evolved into a broad offering of engaging professional development workshops, interactive family activities, informative lectures, and educational programs for school-age children and adults in partnership with a variety of community partners. Together they support Stan Hywet's Education Department's commitment to

"Education on the Estate and Beyond the Gate."

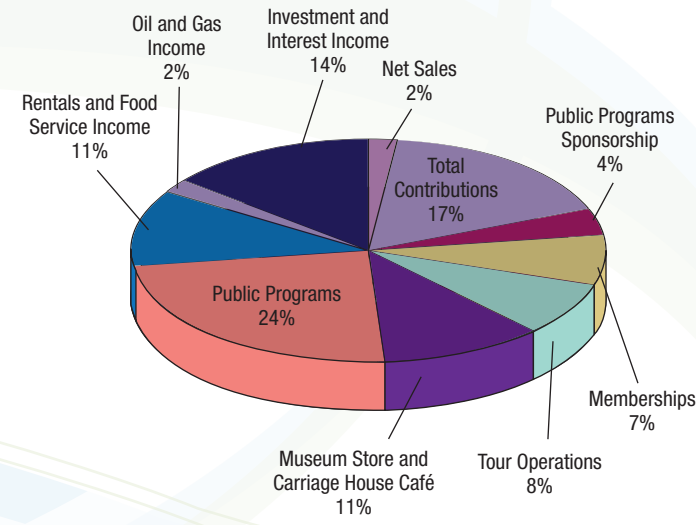

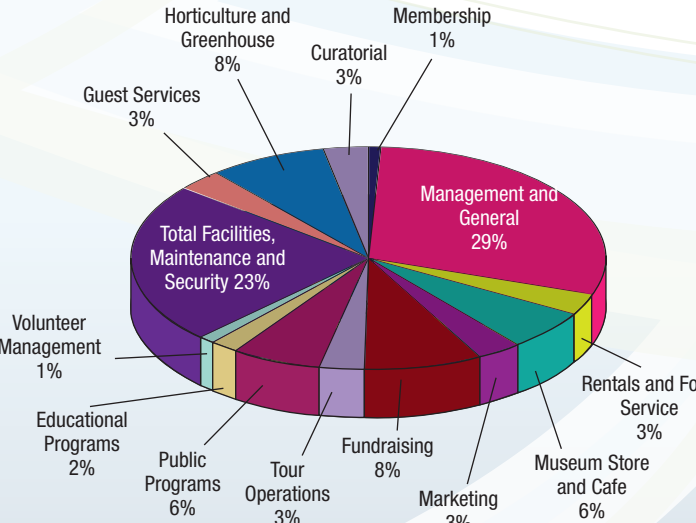

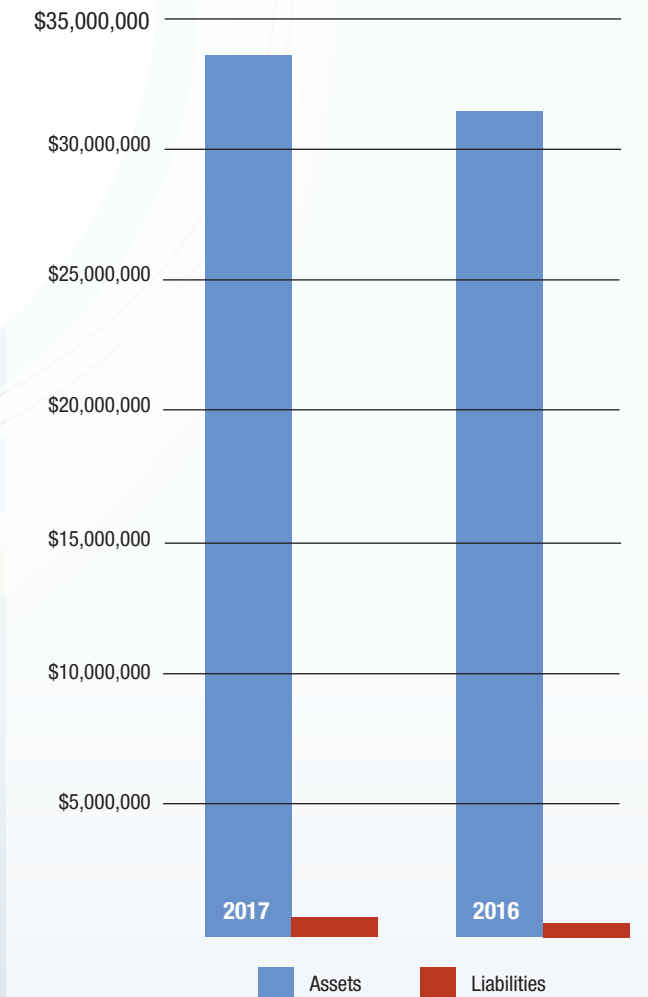
